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Set 03 – Philippians through Revelation

Welcome to "Picture the Scripture"

My goal for using this method is to remember one fact, or verse, in every chapter of the Bible.

To remember chapters in the bible, we need a system to be able to picture numbers. Numbers are hard for people to remember. What I'm now going to share with you will help you not only with the bible, but with anything you want to remember. It's known as the 'phonetic alphabet'. By knowing this system, it will allow us to turn numbers into words. These words become a 'peg' to which we can attach the things we want to remember. You could use this system to learn phone numbers, bible references, addresses, playing cards, and many other things. ¹

HOW IT WORKS

There are 10 consonant sounds for the digits 0-9. Equate the numbers with these following sounds:

NUMBER LETTER/SOUND

- 1 t, d
- 2 n
- 3 m
- 4 r
- 5 I
- 6 j, soft g, sh, ch
- 7 k, hard c, hard g
- 8 f, v, ph
- 9 p, b
- 0 z, s, soft c

Here's an easy way to remember the numbers for each sound:

- 1 t, d Show number 1 by holding up your index finger. Now do that with each hand. If you put on index finger cross ways over the other one, you have the letter 't'. Number 1 is the letter 't.' Then think of football. When a team makes a touchdown, we call that a 'TD.' That will help you remember that 't' and 'd' represent the number one.
- 2 n The letter 'N' has two downstrokes. Hold up two fingers, then turn it upside down. What letter has a single hump? The letter 'N.'
- 3 m-'M' has three downstrokes. One way to remember this is the 3M corporation. Start by holding up three fingers, then turn them upside down. What letter has two humps? The letter 'M.'
- 4 r To remember four, simply think of the last letter in the word 'four,' the letter 'R.'
- 5 I Hold up your hand with all fingers tightly together, except the thumb. Extend the thumb down as far as you can. See how this forms the letter 'L?' Also, you can remember that the Roman numeral for 50 is 'L.'
- 6 j, g (soft) 'sh,' 'ch' If one were to reverse the shape of the number 6, and open it at the bottom, it would look like the letter 'J.' To help you memorize the remaining sounds, remember this saying: JESUS is a GIANT who SHALL CHANGE you. The sounds for '6' are underlined.
- 7 k, c (hard) g (hard) Visualize a 'K' drawn with two 7s. While the number on the left is normal, the 7 on the right is reversed and leaning to the left.

To help you memorize the rest of the sounds, remember this saying: GO KICK A COW.

- 8 f, v, ph A cursive f has two loops like an '8'. To help you memorize the remaining sounds, remember this saying: A PHONE ATE FRUITS AND VEGETABLES. The word 'ate' will help you remember this association with the letter '8.'
- 9 p, b The shape of the letter 'P' reversed resembles the number '9.' To help you memorize the remaining sounds, remember this saying: A PUPPY is a BABY dog.
- 0 z, s, soft c "Zero" begins with the letter 'Z.' To help you memorize the remaining sounds, remember this saying: "the ZOOS are full of CENTS instead of animals."

APPLICATION

Now that you're familiar with the sounds, we can begin associating whole ideas.

For each book of the Bible memorized, visualize all the images taking place at a specific location. For instance, my nephew is named Matthew, therefore all my Matthew pictures will be taking place at his house, in his yard.

This is important because, as you continue to memorize, some of the same key words will be used for other chapters in different books of the Bible. If you don't associate the image with a particular place, it could be confusing as you learn more pictures for different books of the Bible.

Here is an example using the book of Joel:

Associate the first letter of the book - 'J.' Next, associate the chapter number. With these two sounds, create a key picture (word or image) for that chapter. Now you can visualize and associate all kinds of things in the chapter with your picture:



We shine like stars when we hold out the word of life. The book with the word "LIFE" on it will recall 'word of life.' The book is being held out, not up.



A pita has its hands all chained up. The chained hands are pointing to a cross.

Paul was in chains. The cross, our picture for Christ is being pointed at because the chains are for Him.



Verse 13 As a result, it has become clear throughout the whole palace guard and to everyone else that I am in chains for Christ.

A clock is placing a brain on a globe of the earth.


Brain is our picture for the word 'mind.' The globe of earth will help you recall the word 'earth' in verse 19, which is where they put their minds.

On the end of a pier, we have a cross standing. Stuck through the cross is a can. On the can we also see an eyeball.


The eye on the can is for 'I can.' The can is stuck 'through' the cross. Cross is our picture for Christ. 'I can through Christ.'



Verse 13 I can do everything through him (Christ) who gives me strength.

COLOSSIANS

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This cat looks like he's swallowed a cross as we see that shape coming through him. The cat is carrying a hope chest on one shoulder. Sticking out of the chest is an American flag.

The shape of the cross in the cat is for 'Christ in you.' Remember cross is for Christ. The hope chest is for the word 'hope.' The American flag is old glory, which will picture for you the word 'glory.'

Christ in you is the hope of glory.





Christ in you, the hope of glory.

A can is carrying a treasure chest. The top of the chest is open. Inside the chest we see a Cross lying like he's taking a bath. Also in the chest we see treasures and an owl.

Cross is our picture for Christ. The treasure chest is for 'treasure.' Owl is our picture for 'wisdom.'
In Christ are the treasures of wisdom.



Verse 2-3 My purpose is that they may be encouraged in heart and united in love, so that they may have the full riches of complete understanding, in order that they may know the mystery of God, namely, Christ, in whom are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge.

A comb is placing a heart on a shelf that's above the combs head.

We are to set our hearts on things above.



Verse 1 Since, then, you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God.

Colossians 4 C 4 core (apple core)

An apple core is holding up a saltshaker. Out of the shaker some salt is coming out and going onto the lips of the core.

Salt on lips. We associate our lips with our conversation. Our conversation is to be seasoned with salt.
